From the Pastor's Pen..



51 When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. Luke 9:51 (NRSV)

¹ After Jesus had spoken these words, he looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, 2 since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. 3 And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. 4 I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. 5 So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed. John 17:1-5 (NRSV)

Jesus never turned from his purpose in Jerusalem. His destiny was to die on the cross for our sins that we who believe might be saved and have eternal life. Facing certain suffering and death, Jesus prayed that he be glorified.

'Glorified' in this context has always been a bit confusing to me-death on a cross was far from a glorious experience. The term 'glorify' in this context does not have an earthly meaning of power and glory, fame and fortune. In this context, to be glorified meant to become a light that shines on God, like a spotlight directed towards the main event. Jesus did not intend to be the 'star of the show'. By his life and death, Jesus intended to reveal God, to be a light heralding God in a world of sinful darkness. The scriptures referenced above indicate Jesus' resolve to complete the mission God had set before him. Jesus' sole purpose and intent remained resolute to glorify, or shine a spotlight on God, to reveal God's unfailing love for all of creation. The gospels tell us Jesus never wavered from this purpose. The Gospel of John shows Jesus' divine awareness and self-control as he obediently went to his death that we might have life.

What if this Lent we resolved to glorify God with our whole being? I am not suggesting that we should all hang on a cross... Jesus did that once for all of us who would believe. However, we are called by Jesus to daily take up our crosses and follow him (Matthew 16:24). This means to sacrificially live our lives in such a way that we reveal God in our words and deeds. We are called by Christ Jesus to live as beacons of hope for the world around us. Becoming beacons of Jesus' light in the world means choosing lifestyles and life decisions that serve Jesus through serving others over and above our own wants and desires. We were created for a purpose: to worship and glorify God. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we best glorify God by emulating Jesus with our whole life. This requires a singleness of purpose, a resolute desire to commit to being true disciples of Jesus Christ, spreading the Good News of Jesus with every fiber of our being.

My prayer for each of us this Lenten season is that we would each resolve to glorify God with our whole lives. I pray we will never be turned from our life journey to eternity. I pray our lives would be fully committed to sharing God's love through Jesus Christ to the world around us in every way God opens to us to serve, that we also may glorify God with our lives. Amen.
